The Hong Kong Social Enterprise Challenge (HKSEC) has been organised by the Center for Entrepreneurship of The Chinese University of Hong Kong since 2007, with the aim of bringing together students from various local tertiary institutions for the creation of innovative social enterprises with social values. It is hoped that through participation in a series of motivation activities, seminars and training workshops, participants can address current social issues using an entrepreneurial approach and fulfill their social responsibility. Participating teams may even be awarded start-up prize money, enabling them to incubate business plans and turn their ideas into reality.



Since 2017, the Intellectual Property Department has sponsored the Social Ambassador IP Award of the HKSEC to commend the team which shows the highest awareness of intellectual property (IP) protection in its business plan for the competition. The award aims to further enhance participating tertiary students' awareness and understanding of IP rights so that they can learn to protect their IP rights, including inventions, trademarks and copyright.
