2022 Key Statistics

> 90%

78.6% IP




Behaviours

Consumption of Digital Content*

78.4% respondents had not uploaded, downloaded or played any infringing content through unauthorised websites/streaming platforms in the past year

Top 3 reasons –



- Worry about getting infected by computer virus from illegal websites
- Comply with IP laws

13.4% respondents had uploaded, downloaded or played infringing content through unauthorised websites/streaming platforms in the past year

Top 3 reasons –

- Free
- Unauthorised channels are free
- More updated content
- Too expensive to use authorised websites

95.0% respondents seldom / had not bought pirated or counterfeit goods in the past year

Top 3 reasons –



Do not need/ not interested in pirated or counterfeit goods

- The genuine products were too expensive
